Simple Gift offerings made during January are going to support The Beacon, which is a comprehensive day resource center for men, women, and children who are experiencing homelessness in Dane County.

Although we are currently not meeting in person due to the COVID-19 pandemic, your offerings remain important so Bethany's mission can continue. Through the services offered at The Beacon by staff and partner agencies, individuals have an opportunity for a better life. The organization is committed to offering services in an environment where people feel supported and are treated with dignity and respect.

Along with basic needs services, The Beacon is a one-stop resource center for individuals to connect with other area social service agencies who partner with The Beacon.

The Beacon is a public—private partnership. In 2016, Dane County purchased the building that previously housed the Madison Chamber of Commerce — with plans to renovate it and turn it into a day resource center for the homeless. Dane County chose Catholic Charities to operate the center and also partnered with the City of Madison and the United Way of Dane County.

Together, with support from local community agencies, The Beacon forms a unique collaboration between the business, faith, government, nonprofit, and neighborhood sectors.

The Beacon helps over 225 men, women, and children each day, 365 days a year.

2021 Special Sundays

Over the course of 2021, Bethany will participate in several special offering Sundays sponsored by the broader United Methodist Church.

In the sharing of our gifts on these Special Sundays, as Methodists we are able to come together and make a significant difference in a way that no individual can do on his or her own.

The first Special Sunday of 2021 is Human Relations Day on January 17. This Sunday, before the national observance of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday, strengthens United Methodist outreach to communities in the United States and Puerto Rico, encouraging social justice and work with at-risk youth. In addition to the mailed envelopes, Special Sunday contributions can also be made online at www.bethanymadison.org/giving-financially/.

The remainder of the 2021 Special Sunday schedule is:

March 14 — **UMCOR Sunday**: Previously known as One Great Hour of Sharing, this Sunday enables the United Methodist Committee on Relief to reach out through worldwide ministries of food, shelter, health and peace.

April 18 — **Native American Ministries Sunday**: This collection nurtures mission with Native Americans and provides scholarships for United Methodist Native American seminarians.

May 30 — **Peace with Justice Sunday**: This Sunday allows the United Methodist Church to have a voice in advocating for peace and justice through a broad spectrum of global programs.

Oct. 3 — World Communion Sunday: This Special Sunday provides scholarships for U.S. racial- and ethnic-minority students and international students, on both undergraduate and graduate levels.

Nov. 28 — **United Methodist Student Day**: This collection furnishes scholarships and loans for students attending United Methodist-related and other accredited colleges and universities.

SUNDAY SCHOOL PROJECTS




The month of December featured several simple Advent projects. Children made paper chains, thinking first about what brings them JOY and writing or drawing that item on the slip of paper before making it into a loop.


