Porchlight — More Than A Homeless Shelter

Simple Gifts during the month of June are going to support Porchlight, which strives to reduce homelessness in Dane County. Porchlight

collaborates with the community to provide shelter, affordable housing, and support services that eliminate barriers and empower the individuals and families it serves.

Porchlight staff, in conjunction with several other community agencies, as well as Public Health Madison & Dane County, have been working hard on both proactive measures and crisis response plans due to the COVID-19 virus. While the pandemic and subsequent best practices are evolving, Porchlight is continuing to provide essential services during this time, especially for those who are currently experiencing homelessness.



Since December 2020, Porchlight's Men's Emergency Shelter has been

temporarily relocated to the Fleet Services building at 200 N First St. For the foreseeable future, the Men's Drop-In Shelter will continue conducting health assessments upon entry to the shelter. In addition, the City of Madison is providing direct transportation from The Beacon day shelter (615 E. Washington Ave.) to First Street Shelter at 4:45 pm each day, and from First Street Shelter back to The Beacon at 7:30 am each day.

But Porchlight offers many more services. Did you know ...

- It is the largest non-profit provider of affordable housing in Madison, with 350 units across 26 sites, ranging from single-room occupancy units to family units.
- It runs a Dwelling Intervention Grants & Sustenance program (DIGS) that provides housing-related emergency assistance to those facing eviction or needing assistance with a security deposit.
- It administers a Veterans Transitional Housing Program (VTHP), which is a grant and per diem collaboration with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). Located on Spring Street, VTHP is a 24-bed, single-room occupancy, transitional program for single men who are military veterans and are experiencing homelessness or are at risk of homelessness.
- It leads Safe Haven, a day shelter for adults with mental illness on Madison's east side. Shelter guests have access to two meals per day, showers, laundry, bus tickets, mail, and phone services. Safe Haven also provides housing-focused case management and crisis stabilization services funded through Medicaid. Staff specializes in building rapport with vulnerable individuals who may not otherwise engage in mainstream services.

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Worship in the Church Building on June 13

Okay, the time is finally here! It's been fifteen months since we closed the church building and moved our



worship gatherings to being totally online experiences. But on June 13, we will start offering in-person worship gatherings in the building again. It will be wonderful to see each other in person, to pray together, to hear the grand music of the church together! (And for those who still need time before returning, we will be simulcasting all of this on Zoom.)

Now admittedly, worship in the building initially will be different in some ways. In the opening weeks, we will need to restrict how many can attend, and so you will need to sign up in advance. Up to 60 people will be allowed in the sanctuary, and 36 more in

Fellowship Hall. Congregational singing won't be allowed at first. And, masks and six-foot distancing will be required at first. (Though health authorities are quickly relaxing restrictions, in places like churches they still "strongly recommend" masks indoors.)

After-worship fellowship will be outdoors on the lawn. Perhaps the biggest challenge to this: no coffee or snacks at first. Talk about redefining the nature of Christianity! Keep in mind that Methodism founder John Wesley believed that fasting was a wonderful spiritual discipline – here's your chance to try it out, at least for a little while.

More seriously, I know that many of you have considerable anxiety about gathering with other people. That's okay. We have been through a traumatic experience in which our lives were threatened. We have watched as loved ones became desperately ill and even died. So even though scientifically it is now safe for vaccinated individuals to resume their "normal" lives, psychologically all of us still have fears. So it is okay to continue experiencing worship on Zoom for a while if that helps. It is okay to keep your distance – you won't be the only one who isn't ready to hug or shake hands. It is okay to get up and leave the sanctuary if you feel overwhelmed.

It will take some time, but eventually we will all ease back into life close to other people. And what a joyful day that will be!








Library on the Lawn


