## **Alternative Christmas Gift Giving**

**Just Dane**: Just Dane's many programs inspire hope for individuals returning to the Dane County community after incarceration by breaking down barriers that prevent them from fully participating in our community and the lives of their families. Just Dane also supports the families of those incarcerated through reading programs, family visit programs, etc.



**The Playing Field Emergency Fund**: Your gift provides a family in need with emergency shelter, food and transportation. # **Many Special Plans for Advent-Christmas Season**

I am writing this on the day after our Thanksgiving Sunday celebra-



tion. How wonderful it was to have our full choirs back to an (almost) normal way of sharing their musical gifts! We have many special plans for music and worship in the Advent-Christmas season as well:

Pageant on Sunday, Dec. 12, at 10:00 a.m. — With elementary children now being vaccinated, we are planning for the children to offer a Christmas pag-

eant in worship. Some of the narrators will be participating from home on Zoom, but there will be plenty of children in the sanctuary wearing costumes, acting out the Christmas story, and leading us in the carols of the season.

Cantata on Sunday, Dec. 19, at 10:00 a.m. — We will share in a morning of singing and ringing led by our Chancel Choir, Spirit of Hope Choir, A Capella Choir, and Bethany Carillons. The choirs have already been rehearsing for a few weeks to prepare for this special celebration.

Festival of Carols on Sunday, Dec. 26, at 10:00 a.m. — This will be our tenth annual "Festival of Carols." We will hear the stories behind our favorite carols. And there will be plenty of ways for all ages to engage in the celebration, from ringing sleighbells to wearing halos and crowns.

## Simple Gifts for December — "Allied Eviction Prevention Fund"

Simple Gift offering throughout December are going to support our partners with the Allied Eviction Prevention Fund.

The Eviction Prevention Fund assists families in keeping their homes when income is disrupted by sudden emergencies such as sickness, unemployment, or a death in the family. Requests for assistance are screened by the Joining Forces for Families social worker, in collaboration with JustDane staff.

This valuable program is again in need of funds — with overall donations for Eviction Prevention being down, as it was announced earlier this fall at a monthly Allied Partners meeting. In addition, there is an increased number of calls from people seeking assistance.

The Allied Eviction Prevention Fund is made possible by Allied Partners, an interfaith coalition of congregations — including Bethany United Methodist Church — working together with residents in the Allied-Dunn's Marsh neighborhood, which straddles Madison and Fitchburg.

Allied Partners works with members of the neighborhood as well as with service providers already involved in the community to support the neighborhood's physical and economic health, sustainability and the common good.

So please consider giving generously, as your support will make a difference in real and relevant ways.

## **Christmas Eve Offering to Support Global Mission Partner**

Please also consider giving to our special Christmas Eve offering on December 24 to support the Mujila Falls Agriculture Center, which is Bethany's longtime Global Mission Partner in the African nation of Zambia.

At Mujila Falls, men and women of the Lunda tribe learn sustainable and appropriate methods for growing crops and managing livestock. People across a large area benefit from the eggs and plentiful food produced on the farm.

Mujila Falls has been in its current location since 2000 and was led for most of that time by Paul Webster before he returned to the United States in October 2018. Webster shared on Facebook in November 2021 that he is now officially retired.

Over the past three years, Mujila Falls has been led by Temba Nkomozepi, a missionary with the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries. Nkomozepi takes part in a range of agriculture, education, and health projects, as well as church growth and development. Mujila Falls raises essential crops, such as corn, and engages in small animal husbandry, cattle and goat milking, and more.

Note: Bethany United Methodist Church has also long supported Global Mission Partners Ardell and Gordon Graners' important work in the Dominican Republic. However, the Graners are now both retired.


