
Worship Service

als have an opportunity for a better life. The Beacon is committed to offering services in an environment where people feel supported and are treated with dignity and respect.

Along with its basic needs services, The Beacon also is a one-stop resource center for individuals to connect with other area social service agencies that partner in eliminating the barrier of transportation.

In 2016, Dane County purchased the building that previously housed the Madison Chamber of Commerce with plans to renovate it and turn




it into a day resource center for the homeless. Dane County chose Catholic Charities to operate this multiservice day resource center and also partnered with the City of Madison and the United Way of Dane County. Together — and with support from people like you — there is a unique collaboration between the business, faith, government, nonprofit, and neighborhood sectors.

In all, there are nearly 30 partner agencies under one roof working together in collaboration to change homelessness in our community.

BETHANY NEWS



Bethany's First Refugee - 70 Years Ago

According to the January 1952 issue of the *Bethany Fellowship Letter*, on January 1st, a sixty-year old displaced person stepped off the train and smiled his greeting at the members of Bethany's Displaced Person committee who had come to greet him. Ewdokym Kashpor had come to America after having fled from his home country because of Stalin's repressive regime in Ukraine. Unable to speak English, he was greeted by Bethany member Eli Ferris, who could speak Russian.

Although Ukraine had a long history of being repressed by other countries, after becoming a Soviet Republic in the 1920's, living conditions became especially severe for the Ukrainians. In the 1930's, the Soviets purged the country of writers, intellectuals, artists and clergy by deporting them to Siberia. Then World War II devastated the land, destroying hundreds of villages, seventy four cities, and killing many thousands of civilians. From 1944 to 1952, approximately 5,000,000 people were arrested, killed or exiled by the Soviets if they showed any sympathy for a movement towards independence or just identified themselves as Ukrainians.

While in Madison, Ewdokym lived with Bob and Jeanne Adams in the old Coach House which was serving as the parsonage at that time. Bob recalled that because of Ewdokym's genial sense of humor, they had a good time together despite the language barrier. The church soon enrolled him in a special English class at the vocational school and by February Ewdokym was working as a janitor in a residence for graduate students. He also voluntarily preformed tasks at the church and parsonage.

In November, Ewdokym moved to Chicago to join a Ukrainian settlement there. During the next year, he returned to Madison to visit Bob and Jeanne and gave them \$50 to go to the church as a partial repayment for the cost of sponsoring his resettlement. He said his gift was given out of gratitude for "you Methodists who never forget anybody!"






