# May Simple Gifts — The Playing Field

Simple Gift offerings made in May are going to support our partners at The Playing Field, which is dedicated to breaking the barriers faced by low-income families in accessing high-quality early care and education.

The Playing Field is an independent, nonprofit organization that partners with Early Head Start and has rented space inside Bethany United Methodist Church since its opening in August 2015.

It's no secret that quality early education programs are often out of reach for many families. Even with subsidized childcare, the rates at many centers are simply too high for struggling families. Unfortunately, this can mean that children most in need of quality early education are not able to access it.

The Playing Field is committed to making the highest level of early education available to children of varied backgrounds. To accomplish this goal, its enrollment spaces are reserved for children based on three specific funding sources: A third of TPF's enrollment spaces are reserved for families who might choose any high-quality program for their child — but choose The Playing Field because they value diversity and support the center's mission. For another third of the students, TPF attempts to raise scholarship funds to assist families who don't qualify for childcare subsidies, or who would incur very high co-payments. And for another third of its students, TPF reserves spaces for families funded by Early Head Start. Families experiencing homelessness are given priority for these funds and welcomed into the school family.

In addition to May Simple Gifts support, TPF also has a wish list of items that are needed to equip classrooms. If you would like to donate items, check out their Amazon Wish List and select any items that you would like to donate (items may be shipped to Bethany UMC at 3910 Mineral Point Road, Madison, WI 53705 or to your home). Or write a check out to Bethany and put "Wish List" in the memo field. Cash donations will be given to The Playing Field so they can order what is needed.

# PASTOR'S COLUMN



## A Time to Look Back — And a Time to Move Forward

One of the most moving and meaningful passages in the entire



Bible for me is found in the third chapter of Ecclesiastes: *"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance...*"

This passage so beautifully expresses that life brings a wide variety of experiences. Some of those "times" are difficult to endure. But, other of those "times" are wonderful blessings. Perhaps most striking is that times of struggle and times of blessing are so often intertwined: growth often comes about in response to pain, the joy of resurrection comes about through the pain of crucifixion.

Our congregation is in the midst of "transition times" right now. I pray that this experience will be an opportunity for us to reflect more deeply on the gift of time:

- A Time for Saying Goodbye We still have several weeks remaining for saying our goodbyes to each other. Our awareness of transition and loss is heightened right now. But I am confident that blessings can grow out of this time.
- A Time for Saying Thank-you Kerry and I appreciate your many expressions of love and care in these recent weeks. You have already been saying thanks to us. We also want to express our thanks to you. We are grateful for the opportunity we have

had to serve among you, both in times of struggle and in times of celebration.

- A Time for Welcoming In the midst of these times of saying goodbye, don't miss out on the opportunity to extend a wonderful welcome to Pastor Julie Wilson. Pastor Julie is an outstanding leader, with wonderful gifts for ministry. Welcome her, and welcome her gifts. And if she has shortcomings (she undoubtedly will), also welcome that as an opportunity for you to step in and serve where needed.
- A Time for Moving On Some things fall apart in transition times, which can be both bad and good "the way Pastor Greg did it" wasn't always the best way. I hope you will see this as an opportunity to get a wonderful fresh start.

Transition times will stretch us and challenge us, and yes involve a sense of loss. But transitions can also lead to new blessings, and that is certainly my hope for this congregation. You are a wonderful people with a wonderful purpose – don't forget to stay faithful to your mission, carrying forth with the good work of the church.

These coming weeks will be a time for all of us to look back, but hopefully also a time for us to look forward. Or better yet, move forward – with eager anticipation to where God is leading us next. *"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..."*
