Simple Gifts for September — "Harvest of Hope"



During the month of September, simple gift offerings are backing our partners at Harvest of Hope, a statewide program that supports Wisconsin farm families in distress.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

What does a Wisconsin farm family do when it experiences a financial crisis? Perhaps it's due to flooding or other climate conditions. Maybe it's a medical emergency or because of low commodity prices, shifting global markets, or rising costs of fuel or fertilizer.

No matter the reason, or combination of factors, farm families have been turning to the Harvest of Hope Fund for support across parts of five decades.

The fund was created in January 1986 to help people of faith take a stand in support of Wisconsin's struggling family farmers. Harvest of Hope is administered by the Madison Christian Community, in partnership with other local, state, and regional groups, including the Wisconsin Conference of the United Methodist Church. All administrative costs are covered by a partnering organization, so 100 percent of donations given to Harvest of Hope go directly to help farm families in need.

The intent of the fund is to provide a simple process for Wisconsin farm families in crisis to receive financial help. Families submit a brief application and a financial planning form, which are reviewed by the Harvest of Hope Committee.

Support can help farm families address common financial problems, including: power cut-offs, medical or veterinary bills, house or barn fires, feed for cattle, machinery repair, and unexpected weather events (floods, drought, frost, hail, building damage due to snow-load), to name only a few.

Since its beginnings in 1986 and through 2020, the fund had distributed more than \$1.14 million to Wisconsin farm families through more than 1,700 grants — numbers that continue to grow.
