## **Sewing Machines for Bolivia!**

Thank you! Last year Bethany participated in a highly successful Conference project by providing needed motorcycles! Our part was significantly appreciated.

Now the Bolivian Methodist Church has raised another need — sewing machines! Because many isolated communities do not have electrical power some of these will be pedal driven. This was a request made by the Bolivian bishop to our bishop in Wisconsin.

A sewing machine? At first it does not sound as exciting as roaring around the countryside on a cycle. But when a sewing machine becomes part of a rural church, many community women will share its use. Family clothing will be made. Many will sew other products they can take to market to supplement their family's level of poverty.

One other important reality unfortunately needs to be stated. There are too many times the earnings of the husband do not assist the family budget. Alcoholism is a reality. But one thing is always certain, when the mother in the family has a source of income, it supports the children. I have seen these machines in use and the joy and the resource they provide is heartwarming. What a miracle to see one in use in a small adobe hut.

It is no wonder that the Bolivian bishop is asking for these life saving machines. Cost is in the area of \$450 for each machine. Let's go for two!

## Simple Gifts for October — "Mujila Falls Agricultural Center"

Simple Gifts collected in October are going to support our longtime Global Mission Partners in the African nation of Zambia, the Mujila Falls Agriculture Center, which is led by Temba Nkomozepi.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

Bethany has long supported the Mujila Falls Agriculture Center, where men and women of the Lunda tribe learn sustainable and appropriate methods for growing crops and managing livestock. People across a large area benefit from the eggs and plentiful food produced on the farm.

Mujila Falls has been in its current location since 2000 and was led for most of that time by Paul Webster. However,



Paul returned to the United States in October 2018, and Mujila Falls is now led by Temba Nkomozepi, a missionary with the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries.

Nkomozepi takes part in a range of agricultural, education, and health projects, as well as church growth and development. Mujila Falls raises essential crops such as corn, and engages in small animal husbandry, cattle and goat milking, fruit culture, tree nurseries, fish culture, and research.

Nkomozepi is from Zimbabwe, where he received a BS degree in agriculture from the United Methodist — related Africa University in Mutare. He holds both a master's and PhD in agricultural civil engineering, with an emphasis on water resource management, from Kyungpook National University in Daegu, South Korea.

The agriculture center held a field day event this past summer to teach those who attended about the range of important work it takes on. This event was featured on ZNBC, the major broadcaster in Zambia.

#### **ANNOUNCING THE RETURN OF DISCIPLE**

#### Monday evenings at 6:45 pm October 10 - December 19, 2022

Disciple Fast Track, an adaptation of the original, bestselling Disciple Bible Study, provides a viable option for busy people seeking comprehensive engagement over time with the entire biblical text. Fast Track groups meet for a total of 24 weeks, devoting 12 weeks each to the Old Testament and the New Testament. The New Testament class will be offered next January. Participants are expected to read a manageable 3-5 chapters of the Bible daily in preparation for weekly meetings, which last approximately 75 minutes. Lively and engaging video presenters offer insights into the current week's session followed by guided engagement and discussion. Participants have the opportunity to take a spiritual gifts assessment and determine meaningful ways they can serve and live out their discipleship commitment.

## **STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY**

Stewardship Sunday this year is October 9. Pledge packets will be mailed 2 weeks before. Please prayerfully consider your giving and return your giving card to church on this day. If you did not receive a packet in the mail, you can pick one up from the volunteer shelf in the narthex. There are several ways in which you can communicate your 2022 pledge:

- Bring your giving card to church on October 9
- Mail your giving card to the church
- Go on the Bethany website and select We Serve, Giving Financially and Pledge Online. You do not need to sign in. You can enter the amount and interval of giving.
  - The 2023 pledge form will be available October 1. Do not use the 2022 forms by mistake.
  - After entering the pledge, you will have the option of setting up automatic contributions in Realm to satisfy the pledge. It is recommended that you set up contributions for the 5th and/or the 20th of the month.
- If you have set up an account in Realm you can log in and enter your pledge directly into Realm or Realm Connect.

Pledges may be modified at any time. If you do not plan on making a pledge, you will not receive a reminder letter if you return the giving card with a pledge amount of 0.

NOTE: If you have set up an automatic contribution and do not have a Realm account you can make changes to the contribution by filling out an Automatic Contribution Authorization form, available on the website, and returning it to the Financial Secretary. You can authorize a new contribution, stop a contribution, change the amount, the date, or your financial institution account. A voided check is necessary only if you are authorizing a new contribution or changing your financial institution account. Please allow plenty of lead time as changes must be made 3 business days before the scheduled withdrawal date and these changes will only be made on Wednesdays.
