


PASTOR'S COLUMN

Simple Gifts for *December* — "Allied Eviction Prevention Fund"

In December, Simple Gift offerings are going to support our partners with the Allied Eviction Prevention Fund.

This fund helps families remain in their homes when income is disrupted by sudden emergency such as sickness, unemployment, or death in the family. Requests for support are screened by the Joining Forces for Families social worker, in collaboration with Madison Area Urban Ministry staff.

This valuable program is consistently utilized each month to help people in need avoid eviction. So please consider giving generously, as your support will make a difference in real and relevant ways.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

The Allied Eviction Prevention Fund is made possible by Allied Partners, an interfaith coalition of congregations — including Bethany United Methodist Church — working together with residents in the Allied-Dunn's Marsh neighborhood, which straddles Madison and Fitchburg.

Allied Partners works with members of the neighborhood as well as with service providers already involved in the community to support the neighborhood's physical and economic health, sustainability and the common good.

Christmas Eve offering to support Global Mission Partner

Please also consider giving to our special Christmas Eve offering on Dec. 24 to support our longtime Global Mission Partners in the African nation of Zambia, the Mujila Falls Agriculture Center, which is led by Temba Nkomozepi.

At the Mujila Falls Agriculture Center, men and women of the Lunda tribe learn sustainable and appropriate methods for growing crops and managing livestock. People across a large area benefit from the eggs and plentiful food produced on the farm.

Mujila Falls has been in its current location since 2000 and was led for most of that time by Paul Webster. However, Paul Webster returned to the United States in October 2018, and Mujila Falls is now led by Nkomozepi, a missionary with the United Methodist General Board of Global Ministries.

Nkomozepi takes part in a range of agricultural, education, and health projects, as well as church growth and development. Mujila Falls raises essential crops, such as corn, and engages in small animal husbandry, cattle and goat milking, fruit culture, tree nurseries, fish culture, and research.

Alternative Christmas Gift Giving

Are you struggling to come up with a meaningful Christmas gift idea for that special someone who has it all?

We've got a great way to both remove some holiday shopping stress and warm the heart. Simply check out Bethany's Alternative Giving Tree which makes it easy to give a donation to one of four worthy causes. The tree is located just inside Bethany's main entryway, adjacent to the welcome desk and library entrance.

Forms where you can mark your giving selection will be placed near the tree and next to the church bulletins on Sundays. Donations, with checks payable to Bethany UMC, can then be placed in the offering plate or taken to the office. (Write the cause you have chosen in the memo line)

If you like, choose a card from the Alternative Giving Tree for the cause you chose to inform a recipient of your gift in their honor.

The 2022 Alternative Giving Tree options are:

- WI Conference Camps: Donations will support our two WI camps; Pine Lake and Lake Lucerne. The camps provide a great camping experience for all ages and abilities
- Just Dane: Just Dane's many programs inspire hope for individuals returning to the Dane County community after incarceration by breaking down barriers that prevent them from fully participating in our community and the lives of their families. Just Dane also supports the families of those incarcerated through reading programs, family visit programs, etc.
- The Playing Field Emergency Fund: Your gift provides a family in need with emergency shelter, food and transportation. It could go for basic kitchen items, needed prescriptions and medical supplies and more. Every cent of your gift is distributed by staff of the Playing Field to families who otherwise would lack the essentials that most of us take for granted.
- UMCOR: Disaster Response and Recovery. UMCOR responds to disasters in the U.S. and the world by working with communities and local partners. "Early in and last out" is a guiding principle of UMCOR. 100% of your gift will go to disaster relief.


