It was on Easter Sunday morning in March of 1948 that 57 men, women and children first gathered for worship in an old building on Larkin Street and a new church was born... 75 years ago!

Bethany United Methodist Church will soon begin a celebration of it's rich heritage. During worship on the first three Sundays in March, a brief vignette will focus on historical highlights of our past. The month will conclude with the Anniversary Celebration on Sunday March 26th.

9:15: All are invited to gather in the narthex to greet friends and former Bethany pastors, enjoy coffee and treats, and view historic displays from Bethany's past.



10:00: During our worship service in the sanctuary we will celebrate and give thanks for 75 years of faithful service by past members and clergy as well as looking forward with hope to the future. And it will be our honor to welcome Rev. Hee-Soo Jung, Bishop of the Wisconsin Conference, as our special guest preacher.

11:15: After worship, everyone is invited to enjoy fellowship and a traditional ham dinner prepared by Bethany Chef, Steve Nelson. There will be no charge for the meal. It will be a gift from the congregation on its "75th birthday."

Later this year, a special publication featuring Bethany's history in words and photos will be available for all members to enjoy

Soup and Study, Wednesdays During Lent

March 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29 from 6 to 7 pm. Soup and Sandwich meal will be served, followed by a time of study and discussion of our Lenten theme, Seeking: Honest questions for a deeper faith. The meal will be provided, but donations of dessert are welcome. Conversation and activities will encompass all generations.

Sunday Worship During Lent

Each Sunday we will reflect on a different seeking question as we engage in the spiritual practice of seeking. Some of the questions include - Who will you listen to? How do we begin again? The questions won't necessarily lead to answers, but they can help us find clarity and a new perspective. Ultimately, we pray they lead to a new beginning, a restoration, a wider grace.

Palm Sunday, April 2

Come and join the palm parade as we reflect on Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and ponder the question – Where are you headed?

Maundy Thursday, April 6

At 7pm we will gather for a remembrance of Jesus' last meal with his disciples. We will explore the question - Will you wash my feet? We will reflect on how Jesus shows the fullness of his love by removing his robe, kneeling, and washing the disciples' feet.

Good Friday, April 7

Our Good Friday worship service begins at 7pm. At this somber remembrance of Jesus' final hours we will explore the question – Why have you forsaken me? In order to truly celebrate the resurrection, it is necessary to reflect on the scriptures that tell the story of the crucifixion.

Easter Sunday, April 9 – Worship at 8:30 am and 10:00 am

We will offer two worship services on Easter morning. These will be joyous celebrations of the resurrection. Our Easter morning question is – Who are you looking for? Plans for special music and other special events are being finalized.



Simple Gifts for March — "Boliva Project"

During the month of March, Simple Gift collections are going to support a congregation in Bolivia that's hoping to purchase pews.

Located on the Altiplano (which is Spanish for "high plain") at more than 12,000 feet, the church sits in the village of Huanocollo. While the congregation has a few plastic-type chairs, its members dream of having real pews its families and individuals can use — instead of sitting on the cold, earthen floor at the high altitude.

In all, this need is rather modest: 12 pews at a cost of \$100 each. Imagine, for example, purchasing an entire pew where a Bolivian family and their kids can be seated every Sunday! Once we've met this goal, we will help this congregation with other priority needs.

Bethany is involved in this Wisconsin Conference priority that is celebrating our church's relationship to Bolivia that spans a couple decades. This is one project of nine priorities of the Bolivian Conference and affirmed by the Wisconsin Conference.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. You can give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially). If one gives at a different time for this initiative, just mark your gift: "Bolivian Advance, pew project" — and 100 percent of your gift will arrive at this congregation.

Please consider giving generously — and supporting this little Methodist Church in Bolivia with this dream for its members. Your contributions will make a difference in real and relevant ways.

BETHANY RECYCLING PROJECT

Every 45 seconds a garbage truck's worth of plastic waste is spewed into our oceans, killing millions of marine animals every year.

The Bethany-Madison unit of United Women in Faith (formerly United Methodist Women) is an advocate for Bethany UM Church's recycling

project. We advocate/encourage everyone to cooperate with First United Methodist Church, who will submit collections to Terracycle, Inc., and recycle some items that are not collected by our local recycling companies. Together we can make a difference by keeping these items out of the landfills and help us be better stewards of our beautiful Earth.

We are starting small. Categories of items we are collecting in the box by the Allied Drive food shelves include the following:

- ✓ Markers and pens that no longer work, Crayons, glue sticks.
- Old toothbrushes and toothbrush packaging, empty toothpaste tubes, dental floss containers, heads of electric toothbrushes, empty deodorant containers.
- ✓ Plastic straws and plastic ice cream tubs.
- ✓ Used up plastic gift cards and expired credit cards (Cut up any cards with personal info on them)
- Clean plastic caps for glass jars. Regular recycling (Pelliteri) will accept the following if caps are kept on: soda bottles, laundry detergent bottles, condiment (e.g. ketchup) bottles, berry and deli containers.

Most plastic trash items are not profitable to recycle so we must commit to keep them out of landfills and from incineration.


Children's Chimes


