40th Anniversary of the Carillons

The Carillons, Bethany's handbell choirs, are celebrating 40 years at Bethany on April 30! They will play special music, the children will ring chimes, and we will celebrate and give thanks for this special ministry of music.

A bit of history

It was Paul Dvorak who had the idea of sponsoring a bell choir in honor of his father and enlisting Bev Payne to direct it. She said yes, and the bells were ordered. In March of 1983, Bev gathered interested church members and began to teach the basics of bell ringing. In May that same year, the Schulmerich handbells were dedicated in memory of Frank Dvorak, Verona Bernard, Trudy Lybeck, Mr. and Mrs. Edward McCormick, Clara Meyer, Cathy Camp Goetz, William H. Mahaffey, James L. Palmer, Sr., Cheryl Smith, Phyllis Reese, Mae V. Calhoon, Hazel Heggen, and Erwin C. Wells. They were also presented in honor of Bethany's 35th anniversary.

Throughout the following years, the bell choir rehearsed on Thursday evenings, played for worship services intermittently,

and regularly presented a concert in late spring. Bell choirs were also established for the children and for the youth. These bell choirs also performed during worship and for special events.

In 2004, after 21 years, Bev retired as director, and Paul Litterio was hired to carry on the handbell program at Bethany. In the fall of 2016, Paul moved, and Nick Bonaccio was hired to take his place.









PASTOR'S COLUMN



Bethany and MCCI

By now I hope that you are familiar with the phrase MCCI (short for Missional Church Consultation Initiative).



MCCI is an intensive UMC-designed training, coaching, and resourcing model, tailored to individual churches. MCCI honors the past, celebrates the present, and equips churches to partner with God for the future. Bethany has been involved in this process since September. Each month I meet with Rev. Sue Nilson Kibbey (founder of MCCI) and Rev. Scott Carlson (WI Conference Director of Congregational Development) along with 7 other clergy from around the state whose churches have been selected by the Bishop and District Superintendents to be part of this process. Some months we have additional outside experts come for our training.

Following those meetings, I meet with our MCCI Implementation Team to share the resources. With their help we have been bringing these resources to our teams and the congregation. The

most visible and important piece is our Breakthrough Prayer. This prayer is the foundation of the MCCI. We are praying for God's vision for our church, not our own personal wants and needs. In addition to the prayer, we have been talking about and recognizing God Sightings. Looking for ways God is already breaking through in our congregation is an exciting part of the process.

We have also introduced the Primary Leadership Component (PLC). If you haven't already taken the assessment to identify your PLC, <u>click here for a digital copy</u> or pick one up from the lobby. All three PLCs have a role to play in the life of the church. No component is better or more necessary than the others. In fact, they are all integral and serve together to build the synergy of forward momentum. Knowing your role will help you to work with others to build our church.

Another team of Bethany members is working on a detailed report of our ministries, staffing, history, demographics, membership information, and finances so that the consulting team assigned to Bethany will get an in depth understanding of Bethany. At our Express Day this fall that team will come meet with leaders and members to get input on our hopes and dreams for Bethany. Using this information, they will make recommendations specific to Bethany that our congregation will have the chance to review and vote on before moving forward.

On May 22 from 6:30pm to 8:00pm we are having our first MCCI event called Resource Refocus. Here we will learn how we might reimagine the ministries and resources we already have so that we can reach God's vision for Bethany. It is important that everyone who is interested in the life and future of Bethany attend.

Please continue to pray for Bethany and our sister churches in this process. Watch the bulletin and e-banner for information and don't hesitate to ask questions of myself or any of our leaders. Thank you for your prayers and support.

Simple Gifts for May — "The Playing Field"



Simple Gift offerings made in May are going to support our partners at The Playing Field, a child care and early education program that uses a unique model that educates children from low-income families alongside children from more advantaged backgrounds.

The Playing Field has rented space inside Bethany United Methodist Church since its launch in 2015. It is an independent, nonprofit organization that partners with Early Head Start.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

Please give generously, as your support of The Playing Field will make a difference in real and relevant ways.

Quality early education programs are often out of reach for many families. Even with subsidized childcare, the rates at many centers are simply too high for struggling families. Unfortunately, this can mean that children most in need of quality early education are not able to access it.



The Playing Field (TPF) is dedicated to changing this reality by making the highest level of early education available to children of varied backgrounds. To accomplish this goal, its enrollment spaces are reserved for children based on three specific funding sources. One-third of TPF's enrollment spaces are reserved for families who might choose any high-quality program for their child — but choose The Playing Field because they value diversity and support the center's mission. For another third of the students, TPF attempts to raise scholarship funds to assist families who don't qualify for childcare subsidies, or who would incur very high co-payments. And for another third of its students, TPF reserves spaces for families funded by Early Head Start. Families experiencing homelessness are given priority for these funds and welcomed into the school family.

In addition to May Simple Gifts support, TPF also has a wish list of items that are needed to equip classrooms. If you would like to donate items, check out their Amazon Wish List and select any items that you would like to donate (items may be shipped to Bethany UMC at 3910 Mineral Point Road, Madison, WI 53705 or to your home). Or write a check out to Bethany and put "Wish List" in the memo field. Cash donations will be given to The Playing Field so they can order what is needed.
