


PASTOR'S COLUMN

Simple Gifts for July — "Just Dane"



During the month of July, Simple Gift offerings are going to support our partners at JustDane, a non-profit agency that offers an array of direct service programs for individuals and families involved in the criminal justice system.

Life's circumstance or missteps can lead to incarceration or other life challenges that can be difficult to overcome. The philosophy of JustDane is that it's better for everyone when we can ensure a person has the chance to put the pieces of their lives back together — creating a society where everyone has an opportunity to succeed.

JustDane, which formerly was known as Madison Area Urban Ministries, is designed to inspire hope and create real change. The organization accomplishes this through field-tested initiatives that have transformed lives for over 15 years. According to the organization's website (JustDane.org):

- ♦ Journey Home is a program that works to reduce recidivism (return to prison). This work focuses on the areas of residency, employment, support and treatment as well as transportation and education. The program's two-year recidivism rate ranges from 9 to 15 percent compared to the state average of 67 percent.
- The organization's Just Bakery is a 12-week educational and vocational training program. The program works with individuals who are experiencing significant barriers to employment (homelessness, criminal conviction history, lack of education, and/or a lack of work history or skills). After taking the program, students are job ready to pursue their careers.
 - In addition, all proceeds from Just Bakery sales are reinvested into the program and have allowed the program to hire its graduates to work in the program both on the instructional and production side.
- ♦ The program's Healing House is a recuperative care shelter for families experiencing homelessness. It offers a safe, nurturing place for these families to heal when an immediate family member needs care prior to or following a medical procedure or hospitalization.
- ♦ JustDane also provides a range of workshops that provide eye-opening experiences.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

Please give generously, as your support will make a difference in real and relevant ways.

ANNUAL CONFERENCE




Report by Marge Lyford

The Wisconsin Annual Conference (The United Methodist Church's Annual Meeting) was held in Green Bay on June 9- 12, 2023. There were 448 churches represented. Marge Lyford, Carol Clingan, and Rev. Julie

Wilson attended for Bethany.

The biggest order of business was discussion and vote regarding churches that wished to disaffiliate. The discussion and vote were not contentious. Bishop Jung led us in prayer before we voted and emphasized peace. The vote was held on Friday evening and the result was the disaffiliation of 43 churches. Many of these churches were quite small with less than 25 members. Bishop Jung emphasized the strength of the United Methodist connection. The adjacent graph shows the number of churches in the United States who have chosen to remain in the UMC



Dr. Javier A. Viera, President of Garrett Evangelical Theological Seminary led a thought-provoking Bible study Saturday and Sunday morning. The topic was the story of Jacob and Esau and how it relates to racial justice and radical inclusion. He urged that we acknowledge the damage that has been done and take responsibility regarding racism and our willingness to change. He emphasized that we need to work for racial justice.

Global ministries presentation shared that the conference had donated 6 motorcycles, 10 sewing machines, and worked on an elderly housing



project for Bolivia. In addition relief funds were sent to aid the people in Ukraine, and a Korean Methodist resettlement church in the Milwaukee area. They also celebrated that in 2022 the largest conference offering to Midwest Mission was from Wisconsin.

We welcomed visitors from our sister Conference in Korea and heard about the Korea Peace Appeal. A group of Korean clergy presented a request for worldwide prayer for peace for Korea, following 70 years of war. People in attendance were asked to sign a petition for the Korea Peace Appeal.

The focus this year was on radical inclusion and creating a beloved community. The Connectional Table presented a skit to help us recognize our racism and explore how we can better relate to people of other cultures.

We also voted on the closure of five churches including Madison Wellspring and Madison Bashford. As part of the budget processes, we

learned that Bishop Jung will be retiring in 2024 and Wisconsin will likely be merging with Northern Illinois and share one Bishop. We will also be going from 5 districts to 4 districts so there will be some realignment of districts and district superintendents.

There were also many meaningful worship services including a memorial service, retirement recognition and the ordination worship service. At the ordination service two Elders were commissioned as Provisional Elders and one Deacon and two Elders were ordained. Bishop Jung presided over the conference with a positive and hopeful outlook for the United Methodist Church.
