Simple Gift offerings that are made in August are backing The Road Home Dane County, which is committed to ending the issue of family homelessness in our community.



The Road Home relies on the help and support of individuals, congregations and businesses throughout Dane County to achieve this goal. The Road Home believes that for the greater good of our city and for humankind, we can and should join together to make a difference — because every child deserves a home.

Simple gifts are made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also give online by visiting BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

While it might sometimes be hidden from sight, homelessness exists our community. For example, during the 2020-21 academic year, there were more than 700 homeless youth attending the Madison Metropolitan School District.

The Road Home develops long-term relationships with homeless families with children — important work that changes lives. The organization works with families, not only to relieve the immediate crisis of homelessness, but also to build skills, resources and relationships that set the stage for long-term success.

In 2022. The Road Home:

- Spent more than 12,000 hours serving families through holistic, wraparound case management services.
- Served 284 families, including 619 children in all of its programs.
- Supported 14 housing programs to help make affordable housing and support available to families that could not otherwise access housing. And 95 percent of the families supported remained stably housed.

There's no limit to what your help can do for vulnerable families. Your support can have immediate impact by helping families cover rent or buy groceries, and can also be used where needed for ongoing support services.

### **NEW NAME TAGS**

Some have inquired about the warning statement on the magnets of our new nametags, It says "Caution-Magnetic device. Do not use with pacemaker." Apparently there is a slight risk of interference when some pacemakers are near magnets. According to research, the shielding weakens the magnet and it is safe 30mm or more from the pacemaker so wearing on the right side would be safe. #### REMEMBERING FLORENCE CHENOWETH

Florence died recently in her native country of Liberia at the age of 78 years. At Bethany we remember Florence as being a friendly and interesting woman who was active on the Outreach Team.

However, internationally she will be remembered as an agriculturist who became Africa's first female Minister of Agriculture and worked to promote world food security through her positions with the World Bank and the United Nations.

Florence became interested in agriculture at an early age and after graduating from the University of Liberia, she came to the U.S. to study earning a Masters degree in agricultural economics from the University of Wisconsin in 1970. After returning to Liberia, Florence worked at various agricultural jobs until 1977, when she was appointed the Minister of Agriculture by the President of Liberia.

The appointment of Florence to leadership in the government was a historic milestone, not just for Liberia, but for the entire continent because it opened doors for women to hold influential positions in maledominated fields.

However her job was cut short in 1980 when the Liberian government became unstable and its President was assassinated. Warned that her life was in danger, Florence escaped, walking with others to safety in the neighboring country of Sierra Leone. When she was able to travel, she returned to Madison where she went back to school and obtained a PhD in land resources from the University of Wisconsin in 1986.

For more than 20 years Florence worked for the World Bank in Zambia and Washington D.C. and served as the Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO) liaison to the United Nations. Her job required a great deal of travel and interaction with high level politicians.

Ellen Sirleaf was elected as the President of Liberia on 2008 and asked Dr. Florence Chenoweth to once again serve as the Minister of Agriculture. She assented and during her second term was able to improve food security and sustainable agricultural practices in Liberia and increase crop production for the country. During that time Florence was also an advocate for women's empowerment in agriculture. She retired from her position in 2015 and returned to Madison, Wisconsin.

Throughout her career Florence had intermittently spent time in Madison and had purchased a house on Segoe Road. At those times, she and her son, DeVon would attend worship at Bethany. Florence became a member of Bethany in 1994. On Peace Sunday in January of 2020 she was honored by the church, along with Cecile Tuong, for her extraordinary accomplishments in improving agricultural practices in the world as well as empowering women in the pursuit of food security.
