#### November Highlights MCCI Express Day

Our Express Day is scheduled for Thursday, November 9 at 6:30 pm. Everyone is encouraged to attend this interactive training/ dreaming session focused on your insights into what God desires for Bethany and led by the MCCI team comprised of members from other UMCs who have been praying for our congregation all year. An evening meal will be provided at 6:00 pm in Fellowship Hall.

Then, on November 12 the MCCI team will share their report and recommendations (called prescriptions) during worship. The prescriptions will be based on all that they learned and heard from Bethany members during the MCCI process.

Plan ahead for town hall meetings to be held on December 3rd (immediately following worship), December 6th at 2:30 pm, and December 14th at 7:00 pm. During these sessions we will look at the possibilities God has opened through our prayers and reflections. This will be a safe, honest space for members to ask questions and seek clarification regarding the prescriptions. Childcare will be available for the December 3rd town hall. Childcare for the other sessions can be arranged by calling or emailing the church office.

A final vote on whether to accept the "prescriptions" will be held at a special Church Conference on January 7th at 11:15 am.

# Simple Gifts for November — "Africa University"

During the month of November, Simple Gifts collected are going to support Africa University, which aspires to become a world-class university for leadership development in Africa.

Africa University opened in 1992 in Mutare, Zimbawe, and grants bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, and PhDs across various programs. It

is the first and only fully accredited institution of higher learning established on the African continent by action of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Africa University today is home to more than 1,200 students from more than 35 African countries. These promising future leaders are being educated on how to transform their content through dynamic programs that include: agriculture and natural resources, education, health sciences, humanities and social sciences, management and administration and theology. The Institute of Peace, Leadership and Governance offers postgraduate diplomas and master's programs.

The mission of Africa University is to provide quality education within a Pan-African context,

through which students can acquire general and professional knowledge and skills, grow in spiritual maturity, and develop sound moral values, ethics, and leadership qualities.

This university was founded in response to a call by African Bishops for a university for the whole of Africa. The General Conference of United Methodist Church unanimously approved the founding of Africa University in 1988 and made a commitment to provide financial support. After breaking ground on the project in 1991, Africa University opened in January 1992 as the first recognized private university in Zimbabwe.

The desire of the university's founders was to nurture an institution that would be deeply rooted in Africa — drawing its agenda and priorities from the challenges of African communities and combining the social wisdom and indigenous know-how of African people with new knowledge to aid development and improve quality of life on the continent.

#### STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Many thanks to those of you who already returned your estimate of giving card.

- Over 1/3 of those receiving pledge packets have returned their estimate of giving card.
- There are 13 households who have pledged for the first time.
- For 2024 we have received over 65% of the number of pledges and just over 85% of the amount pledged for 2023.
- Of those who have returned an estimate of giving card for both 2023 and 2024, more than 1/3 have increased their pledge for 2024.

However, we were working off a deficit budget for 2023 and are striving not to continue this trend. Every pledge enables us to continue the ministries we have and reach new people. We want to be able to retain and reward our excellent staff as they are critical to our ministries. If you have not returned your pledge card to the church yet (or filled out the online pledge form), please do that as soon as possible. ### SERVING THE HUNGRY AT LUKE HOUSE

Preparing meals for those who are elderly, needy, or hungry has been a long tradition of Methodist churches. Bethany has been following that

tradition through our relationship with Luke House. Luke House had it's beginning in 1983, when U.W. student Paul Ashe became concerned about the hungry people on the streets and decided to set up a nonprofit community meal program and invite Madison churches to get involved. Free noon lunches were initially served in the basement of St. Paul's Catholic Church located on State Street near the U. W. Library. Volunteers from Bethany prepared and served a hot lunch there on the fourth Tuesday of each month. Three years later, it was time to expand in order to add an evening meal and a former upholstery repair shop on Ingersoll Street was donated for that purpose. Volunteers contributed time and money to rehab the old building with a commercial kitchen and large dining room. The building was named Luke House because of a verse in the New Testament about sharing food with those who have none.



Bethany has been acting on that directive by providing food and volunteers to serve a evening community meal nearly every month for the past 40 years!


