PASTOR'S COLUMN



January 7 during worship we will celebrate Communion, the Baptism of Jesus and Epiphany Sunday. As part of our worship



service, we will celebrate star words. The use of star words, also called "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year that has been growing in popularity in churches for nearly a decade now. The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are distributed during the Epiphany worship service. Just as the wiseman followed a star leading them to Jesus, these words are meant to guide us in

our relationship with Christ. Words are drawn at random and used as a guiding word throughout the year.

I have greatly enjoyed this practice for several years now and have heard wonderful comments from others who have chosen a star word. Even if at first, they were skeptical of their word. My star word for 2023 is story. At first, I thought it was an easy word, every Sunday I tell stories and I am often searching for a story to share during my message. However, as the year progressed it seemed more of a call for me to hear people's stories. I took it as an invitation to understand and get to know people better by listening to their stories. Everyone has a story, and I am grateful for the stories I have heard in 2023 and for the reminder to slow down and listen to people's stories.

Some advice for choosing a word is to let the word pick you and resist the temptation to dig around for a 'better' word or to swap with someone else. You may find that the word fits you perfectly. If so, celebrate that, and see how you can be more intentional about sharing your gift with the world. You may find it is a word that offers you the encouragement or challenge you need. If so, receive that gift and let it shape you in the days, and months ahead. You may find yourself resisting the word or even wanting to reject the word. If so, explore the source of your resistance, and be open to what this word may have to teach you. Live with your word, reflect upon it, journal about it, talk about it with others, and pray about it. Discover how this star gift may shine its light on you and your path throughout the coming year. You are encouraged to place your star word somewhere you will see it regularly throughout the year to allow consistent reflection on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word.

I hope those of you who had a star word for 2023 enjoyed your word. I'm eager to hear your star word story! If you are not in worship on January 7, we can get you a star word. I hope you will enjoy the practice as much as I have. I pray that your star word might be a blessing to you in 2024.

Simple Gifts for January — "The Beacon"

Simple Gift offerings made in January are going to support The Beacon — a homeless day resource center that provides community solutions to help men, women, and children who are experiencing homelessness in Dane County.

In 2016, Dane County purchased the building that previously housed the Madison Chamber of Commerce with plans to renovate it and turn it into a day resource center for the homeless. Dane County chose Catholic Charities to operate this multi-service day resource center and also partnered with the City of Madison and the United Way of Dane County. Together — and with support from people like you — this is a unique collaboration between the business, faith, government, nonprofit, and neighborhood sectors. In all, there are nearly 30 partner agencies under one roof working together in collaboration to change homelessness in our community.



The Beacon, located at 615 East Washington Ave., provides a safe shelter for people who are experiencing homelessness seven days a week, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The facility also offers a range of free basic needs and wellness services, including:

- ♦ Light breakfast, coffee, daily lunch
- ♦ Private showers and restrooms
- ♦ Laundry (drop off same day service)
- ♦ Mail center, phones, and copier
- ♦ Day storage
- Oreventative healthcare
- ◊ Private family areas
- ♦ Referrals for mental health counseling
- ◊ Referrals to case managers
- ♦ Transportation between night shelters



In addition, The Beacon provides a range of housing and job assistance services, including classes and access to a quiet computer lab with internet access, where staff can help with resumes and more.

Please consider giving generously, as your support will make a difference in real and relevant ways. In addition to financial support via gifts, The Beacon also welcomes volunteers who are passionate about helping change a person's life.

BOOK BROWSERS



BOLIVIA UPDATE

Fantastic! Thank you Bethany for your response to provide financial support of the Bolivian Home for the Aging. With the total of \$7,286.00 we were able to receive matching funds of about the same amount. These funds will now provide most of the hospital beds, mattresses, room chairs, bedding, etc. for this home. Some of the occupants will be widows of Methodist pastors for whom there is little financial support. Many live in their original primitive adobe homes on the altiplano of 14,000' of altitude. I have had the opportunity of personally visiting some of these widows in the past. In a few months our bishop will join with the Bolivian bishop at this home to celebrate the progress made with our help. Additional needs remain, but this will finance one important step. Thank you for providing this essential comfort and safety for our Bolivian Methodists.

The Christmas tree in the Sunday School hallway was decorated with ornaments created by the Sunday School children. Both hand-colored and jewel collage-style were fun to make!



















Children's Sunday School


