During the month of December, Simple Gift collections are going to support Porchlight, which strives to reduce homelessness in Dane

County. Porchlight collaborates with the community to provide shelter, affordable housing, and support services that eliminate barriers and empower the individuals and families it serves. Its programming would not be possible without gifts from generous individuals, businesses, organizations, and foundations in our community.

Simple Gifts can be made by placing loose coins in the offering plates, or by putting cash or a check in mission envelopes. One can also mail in your offering — or can give online at BethanyMadison.org (click on We Serve and, from the drop-down menu, select Giving Financially).

Porchlight offers a range of core services that include:

- Housing: Porchlight is the largest non-profit provider of affordable housing in Madison, with 350 units across 26 sites, ranging from single-room occupancy (SRO) units to family units with 1-4 bedrooms. Porchlight's largest property is at 306 N. Brooks St. in Madison, which also houses its administrative offices. Porchlight also has housing programs that specialize in working specifically with veterans and individuals with mental illness.
- Men's Emergency Shelter: This shelter, located at 2002 Zeier Road in Madison, provides emergency overnight shelter to male-identified individuals over the age of 18. Guests receive two meals per day, personal hygiene supplies, access to showers and bathrooms, and case management services. Shelter hours are 5 p.m. to 8 a.m.
- DIGS Prevention Program: Porchlight's Dwelling Intervention Grants & Sustenance program (DIGS) provides housing-related emergency assistance to individuals and families in Dane County who are facing eviction and therefore at risk of becoming homeless. Additionally, DIGS offers financial support to those who have secured affordable housing but need assistance with their first month's rent and security deposit.
- Veterans: The Veterans Transitional Housing Program (VTHP) is a grant and per diem collaboration with the Department of Veterans
   Affairs (VA). Located on Spring Street, VTHP is a 24-bed, single-room occupancy, transitional program for male-identified individuals who
   are military veterans and are experiencing homelessness or are at risk of homelessness.
- Safe Haven: Safe Haven is a day shelter for adults with mental illness on Madison's east side. Shelter guests have access to two meals per day, showers, laundry, bus tickets, mail, and phone services. Safe Haven also provides housing-focused case management and crisis stabilization services funded through Medicaid. Program staff specialize in building rapport with vulnerable individuals who may not otherwise engage in mainstream services.

#### **Christmas Eve: UMCOR Disaster Response**

There will be a special collection on Christmas Eve to support the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Disaster Response fund. Half of the collection will support disaster response in the United States, and half internationally. 100% of all money donated goes directly to those in need.

In the U.S., when a disaster overwhelms a community's ability to recover on its own, UMCOR provides training, relief supplies, case management, and supports long-term rebuilding efforts. When a natural or human-caused disaster strikes outside of the U.S., UMCOR provides immediate funds to its partners to distribute food, hygiene supplies and other necessities to ease human suffering. In the long-term, UMCOR works with partners toward recovery and reconstruction, while maintaining focus on disaster preparedness and training to help reduce the damaging effects of future disasters.

It seemed fitting that during the "Wilderness" worship theme this fall, a group from Bethany ventured off the trail at Pheasant Branch Conservancy (PBC) to collect prairie seeds. Under the guidance of a PBC naturalist, we searched for mountain mint, cream gentian, and two types of asters. These seeds will now journey to the Dane County Seed Shed, where they will be sorted and bagged for distribution in the spring to start or diversify local prairies.





#### WILDERNESS WORSHIP SERVICE


The months of October and November took us on a journey through the wilderness. Many people read and discussed "Field Notes for the Wilderness" by Sarah Bessey in small groups, both in person and via Zoom. In worship, we created Wilderness Jars using sand, sticks, rocks, and moss. Sunday School children painted shapes for a tree mobile, illustrated portions of Psalm 139, and learned the song "Like A Rock" to share in worship. Candles were lit during All-Saints Day worship to remember loved ones who died this past year; in addition, congregation members were invited to write names on the prayer table tablecloth of any loved ones in their hearts. These wilderness experiences offered opportunities to reflect, connect, and absorb God's love.
